Marshal Valliant, exceedingly old, comes on from the Pulytechnic School. He made his career in the corps of engineers. Rather a sayant than a military lender, he is now of no account.

Mar-hal Randon, about 75 years old, has no military record. He has been many years Governor of Algeria and Scoretary of War. He is more in an administrative ca-

War. He is more in an administrative capacity than anything olse.

Marshal Baraguay d'Hilliers is equally old, and so one can say, more than of Randou, why he was made Marshal of France. When I was at the military school he was the commanding officer, and was very rough. He has been always so with the troops. At Palestro he was bruintly stupid, and caused the death of Col. Polit d'Yvory, of the Third Zonaves, by ordering him to storm a door without waiting for the can-

Marshal Forey, who commanded in Mexico, is now paralyzed.

Marshal Canrobert, who was an excellent

Colonel of Zouaves, and who made his advancement through the siege of Zantoba, and the 2d of December, 1851, in Paris, but lost the confidence of the army as commander in chief in the Crimea and in Italy. He

ceived important independent commands, and was successful. In Mckico every one here knows his record.

Marshal Le Bouf, Secretary of War, is, like Vaillaut, an old pupil of the Polytechnic School, and served in the arm of technic School, and served in the arm of artillery. The morning paper dispatches from Paris, Berlin, and other points of war like interest, include a report of an engagement near Forbach, so the Rhine, in which the Prussians are said to have lost 3,000 and the French 2,000 men, but there are no particulars. A Prussian force on Baturday penetrated as far as Sierck, for the purposs of destroying the railway, but restred predictively. At 10 o'clock last night regiments were pessing through the streets of Paris on the way to the frontier, Great crowds gethered on the sidewalks cheering the soldiers witdly. All the garders and public places were crowded, and the excitement—the telegraphers tell us—was intense. M. Thiers is assegely denounced by the multitude. The war spirit is evident in the circumstance that a loan of six months treasury bonds to the amount of 500,000,000 treasure was taken up in a few hours. Private subscriptions for the army are opened and money and gif are flowing in. The Emperor leaves for the field on Wednesday. General Changarnier has been placed in command of the reserves, while General Autemarre has been appointed to the command of the Imperial Guard. It is announced that 250,000 French troops are on the Rhine, ready to creas. On the German side, it as stated that the troops of Saxony, Bayeria, and Wurtemburg are in motion.
