**WHAT THE CITY PRESS SAY:**

**TRUE DRAWING.—** Quite a crowd assembled at the Theatre yesterday noon, to witness the Grand Drawing of the North Carolina Benevolent Association. There were 1000 pens in price, and many more in paper drawing. There were also a number of other articles, which the dealers were another in wheel opposite to the former. Between the two was a table, at which sat the Judges and Mr. John London, Commissioner. The Deeds were made up with both sides, and every article was sealed, so that they could be seen and were securely locked, until the drawing began. This was done by means of two little boys, who were securely blindfolded, and the wheel was turned by the hands of the wheel and the other prior to commencing the draw. Quite a respectable crowd was present, and the following amounts drew the principal prizes: No. 3210, \$5,000; No. 6005, \$3,000; No. 3170, \$2,000; No. 3045, \$1,000; No. 1407, \$1,000; No. 4413, \$1,000; No. 3000, \$500. The number No. 3210 was sold to a member of the Benevolent Association. We saw him shoot a great number of times, and we are glad to appr-
