Smith, colored, arrested by chief of police  
Martin, for creating a disturbance on Har-  
gott street, fined \$2 each.

Kate Williams, colored, arrested by of-  
icer Dunston, for being drunk and asleep  
on Newbern street; case continued.

**U. S. COURTS.**—Saturday in the case  
of Wm. Morton, of Virginia, vs. Dr.  
D. R. S. Peete, of Warren county, N. C.,  
the plaintiff submitted to a non-suit.

The U. S. vs. W. T. Shipp, charged with  
detaining letters, was taken up. The U. S.  
District Attorney, Starck, appeared for  
the government and R. C. Badger for the  
defendant. The case was submitted without  
argument under charge of the court.  
The jury returned a verdict of guilty.

In the afternoon the injunction case of  
Anthony Swartz et al., vs. N. C. R. R.  
and officers and D. A. Jenkins, Treasurer  
of North Carolina, was taken up. This  
case is brought to enjoin the Public  
Treasury from using the dividends declar-  
ed on the state's stock in the road for  
purposes other than the payment of inter-  
est on state bonds, and asking the  
court to appoint a receiver on the part of  
the state bond-holders. Messrs. Phillips  
and Merriman and R. C. Badger, of  
this city, C. Cushing of Washington, D. C.,  
and Moses, W. J. Dudo and T. C.  
Brewster, of Philadelphia, appear for the  
plaintiff. The defense is represented by  
Attorney General Shipp, B. F. Moore and  
Battle & Son of this city.
