THE FOURTEENTH AMENDMENT. WASHINGTON, Aug. 21.—The Attorney General has received numerous requests for an opinion as to the effect of the 14th Amendment upon the eligibility of persons to office. NO CHOLERA IN NEW YORK. NEW YORK, Aug. 21.—A painful investigation was made yesterday by Corcoran, Young and Dr. Marsh into the case of Mary Kelly, who died of supposed Asiatic cholera. From the evidence, the coroner was satisfied that it was not a case of cholera, as the woman had been drinking to excess, and had also eaten a quantity of unripe peaches, and the greater portion of a watermelon. The symptoms described by the attending physician were not at all like those of cholera. The Board of Health deny that any person has died of cholera in this city since 1867.
