

The Sentinel. FRIDAY, AUGUST 25, 1871. VOTE OF THE STATE. We give to-day the official vote of the state for and against convention. The majority against convention is 9,345. These returns show that the conservative vote of this year comes within 1,641 of that given for Attorney General Ship last year, while that of the radicals gives a gain of twelve thousand and twenty-five, notwithstanding the fact that it is known that thousands of negro radicals have left the state since the last election. To-morrow we propose to show up the vote in its true light.

SETTING VERDICTS ASIDE. We learn that Judge Watts set aside the verdict of the jury in two several cases at Greenville court, which are now in session. The parties convicted were republicans. One of them was a prominent republican, a new convert, by the name of White. In the spring of 1870 he stole four boxes of tobacco from Mr. Caverton. Mr. C. and Major Blackall tracked him on the wet ground from Caverton's house, where the tobacco was stolen, to his own granary. Going to the house they informed White they had tracked the thief to his granary, and they wished to search it. White said there was no use; the barn was locked and the key in his pocket. Under some chaff they found the tobacco with the name of Caverton on the box. Major Blackall told White, when he denied stealing it, that the shen he had on made the tracks. A plainer case was never before a jury. It is to be hoped the legislature when it meets will set aside Greasy Sam.

Judge Watts gave it out before and about the time of the meeting of the legislature that he expected to resign. If the House had preferred articles against him he would have tendered his resignation, as did Judge Jones.

Tom Lee's evidence alone is sufficient to convict Judge Watts of receiving, corruptly, \$5,000 of bonds in the Kehoe black mailing suit. If that is not sufficient, the legislature will only have to summon a certain member of the bar, and the guilt of the judge will be fully established.

The negroes and radicals will do doubt say the vote against convention was an endorsement of Judge Watts and the bond business. We have no idea the legislature will take that view of the subject.

As to Judge Logan, Chief Justice Pearson and Gov. Caldwell have already expressed themselves in favor of his resigning, because of his ignorance and incompetency. The bar of his circuit are unanimous for his impeachment, as we are informed.

Judge Tongee is famous for setting verdicts aside. He is famous, too, for holding the state. If he were set aside, with Watts and Logan, it would tend to the purification of the judiciary.

Holden who was ready for Grant as emperor, and his son, the lad at West Point, for his successor.
