AN ACT TO CHANGE THE TIME FOR HOLDING THE SUPERIOR COURTS OF ALMANAC COUNTY.

Sec. 1. The General Assembly of North Carolina do enact: That after the 1st day of January, 1872, the Superior Courts for the county of Almanac shall be held on the 1st and 3d Monday before the 1st Mopday of March and September of each year.

Sec. 2. That all process, recognizances and other legal documents, parts of law and criminal actions which have already been issued or may hereafter be issued and held returnable to Spring Term of 1872, shall be deemed to have been issued and held returnable to Spring Term of 1873, and so forth, to the 1st and 3d Monday before the 1st Mopday of March and September of each year.

Sec. 3. That all laws and parts of law inconsistent with this act are hereby repealed.

Sec. 4. This act shall be enforced from and after its ratification.

In General Assembly read three times and ratified the 4th day of December A. D. 1871.
