INDUCTION OF THE MAYOR ELECT INTO OFFICE.—MEETING OF THE NEW BOARD OF CITY COMMISSIONERS.—Yesterday at 9 a. m., Col. W. H. Harrison, the retiring Mayor, administered the oath to Wesley Whitaker, the Mayor elect, and inducted him into office.
At 10 a. m., the Board of City Commissioners organized, Mayor Whitaker in the chair. The members cast passed their certificates of election to the Clerk and the Mayor administered the oath of office. Those present were Messrs. Stronach, Johnson, Upchurch, Prairie, Battle, Dunston, Ed. Hillson, Col. and Gorman. Mr. Churchill being absent. The Board is the same as last year with the exception of Mr. W. C. Stronach.
Mr. Battle moved that when the Board adjourn that it adjourn until Monday evening at 8 o'clock, when the election of officers shall be proceeded with.
Dunston objected to the postponement. He said he was a working man and was troubled with a host of office-seekers. He could not attend to quit his work and be interviewed by the host of office-seekers that were besieging him. He moved the matter be disposed of at once.
Mr. Prairie agreed with Dunston about the annoyance caused by office-seekers, but thought that the election should be postponed until a full Board was present. Mr. Churchill was absent.
Mr. Battle's motion was put to a vote and adopted.
On motion of Mr. Battle, the chair was authorized to appoint a committee of three to report rules for the government of the Board. The chair appointed Messrs. Battle, Dunston and Prairie as said committee.
On motion of Mr. Battle, it was ordered that hereafter all applications for office to come before the Board must be filed with the Clerk.
On motion the Board adjourned to meet on Monday evening at 8 o'clock.
