NEW POSTAGE LAW.—The most impo tant change is the authorization of one cent postal cards for correspondence or for printed circulars. The open card will only be used. The face of the card will bear a one-cent strap, and will be provided with lines for the address, as back will be ruled for the letter.

The price of the card and stamp will be only one cent. They will be ready for ale in some three or four weeks.

The postage on circulars, newspapers and other transient printed matter, which under the old law was two cents to every four ounces, or lust, is now one cent for every two ounces or less.
