Limited arreats have been afficied by drought, but raim-FROM WASHINGTON. were quite general during the latter part of June. On the Atlantic coast showers nave been so frequent and heavy since 20, as to delay cultivation and promote the growth of weeds and grass. Before that date a season of o mpetalive drought of seven or eight weeks had been suffered in a portion of this district, while other ounties represent the weather as having een uniformly favorable. The variation in the rain fall during the past month has been considerable in the Atlantic States ranging as follows : At the

stations reported from one to two luches to four; ninety five in Virginis; from one o seventy-live ; forty-nine in North Carolina : from one to three. N nety five in to four. Eighty-nine in Alabama. In the States of Mississippi in the rain fall has been abundant. The lowest records in several States being from two to four inches and the highest from four to five to

> In Tennessee the range is from 2 to 64 sches to teq. Sixty three in Louislans; from 4 to 35 to II in Texas; from 3 to 6 to 9 in Ar

Virginia, North Carolina and South Caro-lina, in which the average rain fall in May and June wea light, and Arkanasa where injury has resulted from heavy and un-seasonable rains; in all the other States seasonable raise; in all the other states the averages are above 100.
