**HISTORY OF THE BAPTIST CHURCH IN RALEIGH.**—We resume our notes of Dr. Pritchard's sermon. In September, 1848, Rev. James Holmes, of New York, was chosen to act as pastor until January following. He was an impostor, and was published as such by Messrs. J. B. Biggs and W. W. Vass. In July, 1850, Rev. T. W. Toby was elected pastor, in which capacity he continued until July, 1853. The next pastor was Rev. A. McDaniel, who served the church one year. In January, 1855, Rev. G. W. Johnston became pastor but soon resigned on account of ill health. He recommended Rev. Thos. E. Skinner as his successor, who was unanimously chosen, and entered upon his duties in the beginning of 1856. Dr. Skinner's pastorate was the longest as it was the most eventful and prosperous that the church ever enjoyed. It continued nearly twelve years, and was not only distinguished by the many valuable additions to the church, but especially remarkable because during his administration the church displayed great liberality of spirit in the erection of the beautiful and excellent edifice in which the congregation now worships. Dr. Pritchard very justly insisted that the Baptists are mainly indebted to Dr. Skinner—to his generosity, enterprise, good taste and largeness of faith for their present edifice, which is really an ornament to the town and a credit to the denomination. The reverend gentleman said touchingly, that as long as the graceful spire of this elegant structure lifts its head to the skies, so long will it remain an honor to the memory of Thos. E. Skinner. This acknowledgment of the great services that Dr. S. had rendered to the denomination, was very grateful to many who were present who love and esteem that genial, lovable, noble-hearted man, but to none was it more pleasing than to him who traces these lines. Long may his memory be enshrined in the hearts of his people as it is in the hearts of his friends!

The house cost about \$75,000. The lot cost \$1,000 and was given by Dr. Skinner, and our two esteemed townsmen, Alfred Williams Esq., and Maj. A. M. Lewis. Dr. Skinner contributed also the iron railing around the Church, which cost \$1,000. We are under the impression that he gave largely to the erection of the building. The new Church was dedicated on Tuesday night, Nov. 11th, 1868, during the session of the N. C. Baptist State Convention, the sermon being preached by Rev. J. L. Burrows, D. D., of Richmond, Va., and the late Rev. Jas. McDaniel D. D. offering the prayer. The house was not occupied regularly until Sept. 1869. The membership stood, whites 228, colored 305—total 433.

In Nov. 1863, Dr. Skinner went to Europe, when Rev. Dr. Pritchard, the present pastor, who had been banished from Baltimore by military authority for Southern sympathy, (and was also once confined in Fort McHenry, if we mistake not, for the same offense), assumed the duties of the pastorate and well discharged them until June 1865, when Dr. Skinner returned and resumed his duties as pastor. In Sept. 1867 Dr. Skinner accepted a call from 1st Baptist Church, Nashville. Dr. Wm. Williams, of S. C. was called by the Raleigh Church, but after a visit to this place, declined the invitation. Rev. Dr. Pritchard, then in charge of the 1st Baptist Church, Petersburg, was recalled to his native State, and assumed the duties of pastor in Feb. 1868. At that time the membership was about 270—and it is about 380. The pastor then drew some practical lessons from the history of the Raleigh Baptist Church. The Church has had 16 pastors, but has never given to Christianity a single minister. Many revivals have blessed the Church and community.
