We have this in reply to a letter from P. L. Moore, Esq., the manager of the Bank and Traction Company of this place, that Capt. Frazer, of the Bollingbrook Steam Pipe Company, No. 1, of Petersburg, Va., has written that his company will visit Raleigh on the first Monday in October, bringing their steam engine, hose, carriage and horse. TO DEDUCT A SHOE ROOM.—The patent having been removed, all linen, articles, sheets, towels, pillow cases, and bedspreads, are to be distinguished by placing them in a large vessel containing either Condy's fluid or the solution of chloride of lime or soda. The blankets, counterpanes, and woollen articles of clothing are to be suspended on lines, and mattress and beds on the back of chairs; the furniture to be removed from the walls, the windows closed, paper pasted over the cracks. The chimney opening of the fireplace is also to be closed up. An open vessel is next placed in the middle of the room, into which is put a quarter of a pound of stone blintstone; the blintstone to be ignited, and the person who does it must immediately leave the apartment, close the door, and pass paper over the cracks. At the expiration of twenty-four hours the room may be entered, and doors and windows thrown open, and the fumes of the sulphur allowed to escape. By this process the room and everything in it may be considered thoroughly disinfected.

FROM WASHINGTON.

WASHINGTON, Sept. 11.—The following items of news have been received from the Department of State:

A Frenchman publicly contradicts the report that he intended to marry Nellie Grant.

Loys, a Paris journalist, states that there is a great trouble in Spanish waters, and measures have been taken to prevent the insurgents from crossing or concentrating. The garrison, in barge, attacked the barracks and burned down. The large prisoners were rescued. The Captain-General of Catalonia has been suspended to Madrid in charge of a correspondence with supporters of Carlist.

The private secretary of Duke Montpensier had been arrested at Madrid.

The Government has obtained a clue to the conspirator on the part of Montpensier in the interest of Don Alfonso.

Brazil elections were disorderly, and several citizens were bayoneted.

Pacific negotiations between Brazil and Argentine republic are progressing favorably.

Senator Zorilla, President of the Spanish council, is confined to his bed from sickness.

The President recognized A. M. Rhoades John, Austrian Consul at Mobile; Robert Barib, Austrian Consul at St. Louis; F. W. Hanewinkel, Austrian Consul at Richmond; Julius Kaufman, Austrian Consul at Galveston.

The President appointed David Quaer, Surveyor of Customs at Savannah, Ga.

The Supervising Inspector General of Steamboats, has directed an investigation into the cause of the boiler explosion yesterday on board the steam tug, Agnes, at Norfolk, Va.
