MUSICAL INSTRUMENTS—The best way to prevent gum asperine or heated starch, or other articles of paste or macilage, is by a few drops of a milk solution of carboline. This added to it enables one to keep it indefinitely. I take gum asperine an ounce and a half, water three ounces, making a thick, strong emulsion (the thickness saves a great deal of time in its use), and then add fifteen drops of saturated solution of carboline in water. No weather effect it; it does not sour, and is ever on my table with the brush for use. I can afford the expense of buying cheap muslin muslin.
