WELCOME TO PETERSBURG AND CHARLOTTE.

ARRIVAL OF THE HORNET COMPANY—THEIR RECEPTION—GRAND PARADE, &c., &c.

Yesterday (Tuesday) morning the Hornet Steamer Fire Company arrived in the city by the early mail from that place, and some received by the companies of this place, and the Petersburg Bollingbrook Company. The same ceremonies were observed in honor of the occasion of the reception of the latter company on Monday afternoon. The march was then directed to Metropolitan Hall, where, after their introduction in some 'openers,' W. H. Pickett, Esq., in behalf of Mayor Whitaker, who continues very unwell, welcomed the visitors in appropriate remarks. Mr. Pickett spoke as follows:

FRIM WASHINGTON.

Washington, Oct. 7.—The British Commission has decided an important principle in two cases for tobacco burned at Richmond, Va. The claimants, Scotch merchants, alleged themselves as the owners of the tobacco in question at the outbreak of the war, and that the President, by the proclamation of the blockade, and the Congress by the non-intercourse act of June, 1861, prevented their removal of the same, although under the non-intercourse act the President was permitted to license export and limited trade with the insurrectionary districts, as the claimants allege such license were given to those willing to take an active part against the rebellion in preference to aliens and neutrals. The claimants charged the subsequent destruction of their tobacco in retail and limited quantities by the U. S. and claimed the U. S. liable therefor. On demand for memorials, the Commission decided against the holding, and in effect that the proclamation of blockade, the non-intercourse act, and the act of June 1861, were within the law of the nation. If this claim could have been sustained, the United States would be liable for an immense amount of property in the South owned by aliens at the outbreak of the war.
