FROM WASHINGTON. Washington, Oct. 7.—The British Commission has decided an important principle in two cases for tobacce burn od at Richmond, Va The claimants ed at Richmond, Va. The claimants, scotch merchants, alleged themselves as the owners of the tobacco in question at the outbreak of the wer, and that the President, by the proclamation of the blockade, and the Congress by the non intercourse act of June, 1861, prevented their removal of the same, although under the non intercourse act the President was permitted to license special and limited permitted to beense special and limited trade with the insurrectionary districts; as the claimants allege such license were given to those willing to take an active part against the rebellion in preference to aliens and neutrals. The claim anta charged the subsequent destruction and less of their tobacco to this prevention of rem val by the U/S, as d claim d the U. S. liable therefor. On denutrer to memorials, the Commission decided against the holding, and in effect that the proclamation of blockade, the non
