FROM NEW YORK. THE HOUSE MALADY, AC. NEW YORK, Oct. 26 .- Horse malady has now spread to such an extent that almost all houses in the City are said to be suffering in one form or another from ymptoms of the epidemic. There are usands of horses which have not yet been put upon the sick list, but abservahave germs of disorder in their system. in its developments, and it is not known yet whether all its stages have been seen.

It is estimated that in the city and in mediate vicinity there are from 30,000 to 40,000 horses suffering from well developed symptons. The disease has begun to exhibit new and slarming phases which are looked on as highly dangerous, the inflammation of the throat extends to the lungs and rapidly grows more alarming, and the coughing is fear-fully convulsive—the animal pants for breath, and becomes quite cold about the extremities. This seems to be a warsing of fatal ending of the malady, and if it continues as widely prevalent as it is now for a few days longer, there can be little doubt that hundreds of horses affected will die. The street-car companies, som of the livery stable proprietors and man of the down merchants are still working their deceased horses, and in many case signs of fatility are becoming more and more alarming. In the stables where all business is suspended until the disease is more alarming. In the stances where an business is suspended until the disease is mastered, very favorable reports are made.

In some instances convalescence of horses is very rapid. The trotters and racers stabled in the city seem to have nearly all escaped the discase.
