Our city was visited again last night with a fire that threatened, at one time, to prove at least equally disastrous with that of last week.

The alarm was sounded a fittle before 12. o'clock and came from the wooden building on South Front street, near Dock. and, between the brick buildings occupied, on the north, by Messrs. Parker & Taylor, Hart & Bailey and Geo. \. Peck.

We were early on the ground, but could not tell exactly where it orig inated, but the flames came, apparently from the partition between the two stores In a short time they leaped up above the roof, but were happily confined to the one

The losses, as far as could be ascertaine last night, are not beavy. Mr. Higbie but nearly all of his stock and was insured for \$1,000. G. W. Price saved about one-half, but his stock was light. Parket & Taylor's stock was valued at \$20,000 and on this there was an insurance of \$12,-000 in various companies. It is imposs ble, as yet, to ascertain their loss, but it will probably reach, by damage and re-moval, between \$3,000 and \$3,000. The building destroyed was owned by Mr. L. A. Hart and was hardly worth more than \$800. It was insured to about its value.
