FROM SPAIN.

The House bill declaring that the exemption allowed by the bankrupt law shall be the amount allowed by the constitution and laws of each State in 1871, and that such exemptions be valid against debts contracted before the adoption of such State constitutions as well as to those contracted afterwards, and against liens by judgment or decree of any State court, was taken up and passed.

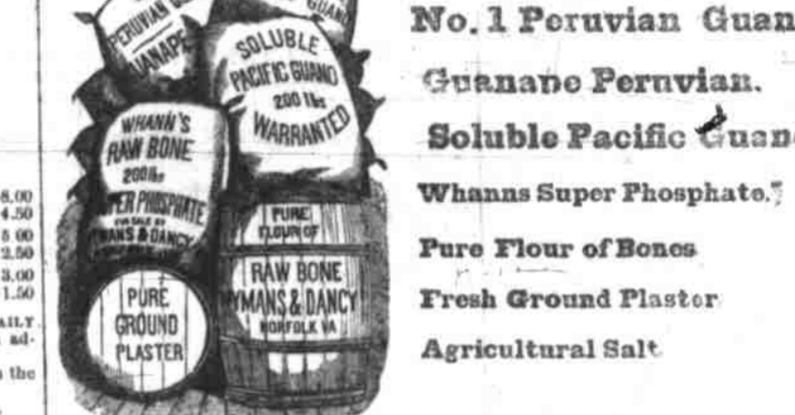
