Upon a resolution of the tusion legislature to reinstate certain courts in the New Orleans parish government, McEnry called out the militia of the parish. No damage seems to be apprehended here or there and up to this hour no federal action has been taken. It was understood that the McEary government should be allowed to organize so as to obtain the status before the courts and was not to be interfered with unless it attempted to seize the State government.
