GENERAL NEWS. SAN FRANCISCO, May 4.

Gen. Davis has arrived, eig Lava Beds and Salt Lake.

Great excitement was caused in mining circles by a card of Gen. J. F. Harrison, of New Orleans, Superintendent of the Stafford Line Star Silver Mines, denounclog the whole project as a deliberate fraud and swindle. Nearly \$200,000 in stock had been taken and paid, principally in Arizona.

WASHINGTON, May 4. A committee from the two well-known Chi Phi frateralty of the North and South, held a session in this city on Friday and Saturday, and have agreed upon terms of consolidation. The committee present on the part of the Northern-order were Wm. Sutphen, of New York; Chas. F. Hendrix, Cooperstown, N. Y., and Otis C. Tiffany, Washington, District of Co lumbis; and on the part of the Southern order, Wm. F. Bishop, of Petersburg, Va., Edward Bland, of Welleville, and Meade Hastings, of Richmond, Va. There are in all about five thou sand members, with two chapters of Post Graduates, one of which is in Philadelphis, and the other in New York.
