Rev. W. S. McDermid. We have referred editorially to the sad death of this gentleman. We have learned some particulars from the Fayetteville Eagle which we copy:

The Gales Family—Some Reminiscences.

We mentioned the other day that we had been honored by a visit from Thos. Gales Forster, Esq., grandson of the late Joseph Gales, Senior, founder of the Raleigh Register—a paper that was published for fifty years in the buildings now occupied by the SENTINEL.

By the Constitution of the United States, by art. 1, sec. 8, § 1, empowers Congress to lay and collect duties, imposts and excises, and declares that "all duties, imposts, and excises shall be uniform throughout the United States."

By the Constitution of 1789, the entire and exclusive power over these subjects was granted to the Congress of the United States. Could Congress, after the adoption of the Constitution of 1789, have passed a constitutional law, regulating "duties, imposts, and customs" and made them uniform within the meaning of the constitution, by enacting that they should exist after the passage of the law in the several States, as they had existed therein before its passage?

The great objects of bankruptcy laws are to treat those who are enabled by debts, which they cannot pay, and to allow them to keep enough of their estate for present subsistence and to commence anew their labors for future livelihood.

Constitutionality of the Bankrupt Law.

The following communication is from a leading lawyer not only of North Carolina but of the United States. The opinion of the writer on this or any other question of law carries great weight in the estimation of the most eminent of the profession:

For the Senator, The Constitution of the United States, by art. 1, sec. 8, § 1, empowers Congress to lay and collect duties, imposts and excises, and declares that "all duties, imposts, and excises shall be uniform throughout the United States."

Suppose Congress, by the act of 1802, (the first act on the subject of naturalization) had declared that thereafter each State might naturalize aliens and make them citizens of the United States according to its own discretion.
