There is no mistaking this; it shows most plainly that it is the purpose of McMahon, who just now is the strong man of France, to overthrow sooner or later the present form of government. He will probably be able to dictate his own terms to the form of government he prefers.

We have considerable confidence in the integrity, honesty and ability of the leaders at Madrid, and we hope that they will be able by energy, prudence, and pluck to achieve a victory, complete and decisive, over the enemies of the Federal Republic.
