THE McDOWELL PARTY TAKE QUIET POSSESSION OF THE ROAD.

The long agony is over, and Charlotte and Statesville, Mocklenburg and Iredell breathe free. The McDowell party yesterday morning took possession of A. T. & O. R. R.

No legal proceedings had been instituted by the McDowell party to obtain possession of the road, and from the day of the annual meeting until yesterday, Col. Johnston, his Board of Directors, employees, and appointees, continued to exercise their usual duties, unmolested.

A meeting of the McDowell Board was held in the city on Monday. At that meeting Col. S. A. Sharp, of Statesville, and Capt. S. B. Alexander, of Charlotte, two of the Directors, were authorized to ask for possession of the road, and if they were refused, to take possession of it.

Train left for Statesville that afternoon just as usual. Col. Sharp was on board, as was also an extra conductor and an engineer. Yesterday morning when Mr. J. A. C. Gruber, the regular engineer, went to his engine, preparatory to running it, he found a strange man in the cab.

At present Messrs. Gormley and Hand are succeeded by Messrs. Sharp and Lewis. In a talking up of the matter, one who ought to know whereof he speaks, remarked that these gentlemen were "temperamentally suspended."
