## DOMESTIC NEWS.

### MISCELLANEOUS.

SAN FRANCISCO, Aug. 2.

A private named Henry Murphy, company M., 5th cavalry, was shot dead by the camp butcher.

Only nine ships cleared with wheat this year against fourteen same time last year.

The farmers are inclined to hold the new crop for higher prices.

CUMBERLAND, Md., Aug. 2.

The freight train ran into the grave train, killing 1 and hurting 3.

EVANSVILLE, Ind., Aug. 2.

### FROM NEW YORK.

### SPANISH AFFAIRS.

MADRID, Aug. 2.

An insurgent frigate entered Malaga harbor and departed eastward closely followed by a German vessel, and her capture is probable.

The insurgents of Grenada offer to surrender.

In the Cortes to-day a resolution of censure directed against the insurgent deputies, was debated. Senor Castilar made an eloquent and patriotic speech counseling moderation on the part of the republicans. The resolution was adopted by a vote of 195 to 15.

The Majara tobacco factory, the last refuge of the insurgents in Seville, has been captured by the troops, and a large number of prisoners were taken, among whom are several foreigners, members of the International Society. The Carlist forces, one thousand strong, attacked Portugal, seven miles from Bilbao, this afternoon. The garrison made a vigorous and successful defense. The Carlists were defeated with heavy loss and driven over Salido river. The town of Alahama, 13 miles from Murcia, has proclaimed her independence. The Junta has been organized, the first act of which was to levy a contribution of \$25,000 on the inhabitants.

The report that the frigate Villa de Madrid had joined the insurgents is officially contradicted. The insurrectionary fleet which left the harbor of Almeria was last seen heading for Malaga. Two other frigates in the hands of the rebels are at Malaga, trying to raise contributions from the citizens. Four German men-of-war are in the harbor watching.

### FROM PARIS.

PARS, Aug. 2.

Carlists announce that Don Carlos has captured Estella with his entire garrison and has surrendered as prisoners of war.

Disturbances are reported at Ron L'Espin, in the department of Vosges. The sub-prefect was beaten by a mob who cried vive Thiers, vive Gambetta, during the evacuation of Vosges by the Germans, there were cries of vive la monarchie. The Perfect Department of Upper Loire has forbidden the sale in the streets of the Radical Journal Le Peuple Sovrano.

### FROM PRUSSIA.

BONN, Aug. 2.

Germany propose to Congress, maritime powers as to decide status and treatment of insurgent Spanish ships.

### FROM ITALY.

Rome, Aug. 2.

The prime minister of Minghetti, has written a letter to his constituents denying that the Italian government contemplates a new loan.

### FROM LONDON.

LONDON, Aug. 2.

A dreadful accident occurred this morning on the Northwestern Railroad near Wigan, to the Scotch tourist express train from London. Twelve persons were instantly killed and thirty were wounded. Among the killed is Sir John Anson. Many of the injured will die.

### FROM WASHINGTON.

WASHINGTON, Aug. 2.

### FROM OREGON.

PORTLAND, Aug. 2.

A few broke out at four o'clock this morning. Two blocks are now in flame and it is still spreading. The departments of War, Revenue, Oregon City and Salem are on their way here. Water supply is failing. The fire commenced near Metropolitan Hotel. Nearly all the city located by fire Hill street north, by Broad street in the west, by Columbia street on the south and the river on the east, is in flames.

### FROM NEW YORK.

NEW YORK, Aug. 2.

Imports for the week have had a few declines, whereas those are general and moderate.

Bank statement shows loans increase \$397,100; specie decrease \$677,100; legal tenders increase \$287,400; circulation decrease \$37,100.

The receiver of taxes refused to accept bonds for the release of Pacific Mail Steamers.

Six sun strokes yesterday.

Judge Pratt, of Supreme Court, to-day rendered a decision sustaining the authority of the Board of Health to proceed against a Fertilizer Manufacturing Company as an Insurance Company has asked an injunction.

The Judge says the statute rests on the discretion of the board to determine whether it is a nuisance, and to destroy it summarily. If the board exceed the powers or do an unauthorized act the remedy is by action for damages against the members. The injunction was denied.

### FOREIGN NEWS.

#### FROM MADRID.

MADRID, Aug. 2.

Six thousand workmen of Alcoy propose to consolidate the municipal government of that town to maintain order.

Many persons who joined the insurrection of the South favor the independence of Cartagena, have abandoned the cause in consequence of the excess committed by the Insurgents during the occupancy of Seville by the insurrectionist.

Buildings in various quarters were fired in a number of streets every house and store were entered by the insurgents and plundered of its contents. The conduct of General Contreras in bombarding the defenseless town is producing an immense reaction throughout the country in favor of the National Government. The frigates seized by the insurgents at Cartagena are partly manured by the galley slaves. The government has received intelligence from malaga, that upon the arrival of the insurgent frigate at that harbor that the commanders of the English, French and German squadrons held a conference with General Contreras in which they urged him to order the return of the seized war vessels to Cartagena. The government was further informed that the commanders had decided to hold General Contreras as hostage till the vessels are returned. Eight siege guns and two mortars have been sent to the Republican troops before Valencia to assist in the bombardment of that city. All the communications between Madrid and cities Andalusia are interrupted by the insurrectionists at Barcelona. Don Alfonso and Sabelles the Carlist commanders at Pablo De L Lusus are fortifying the town. They are also preparing to order a relay on mass on Pablo De L Lusus in this province 40 miles Northwest of Barcelona.
