This is a mistake. The crop in size is not an average, but in quality it is very superior. This is the latest news from that great tobacco county.

In Granville county the fine tobacco can only be grown in certain sections. It is more profitable to raise the weed when it brings from \$50 to \$150, as the cost-cured does, than to plant cotton.

THE COMPETITORS OF THE SOUTH. The highest authority on cotton statistics in Europe, Ott Trumpler, states that during the year ending Aug. 31st, 1872, 4,733,000 bales of cotton were consumed in Europe. In the United States 1,210,000 bales were consumed—in all 3,983,000 bales.

The South has furnished to Europe an average of 1,801,000 bales during the last seven years. During the same period other countries supplied 2,714,000. This amount is divided as follows: India 1,517,000 bales, Brazil 596,000, Egypt 250,000, other countries 348,000.

It will be seen that the South has no one great rival in the amount produced, although all combined produce more. The cotton of the South is far superior to all others, save the comparatively small quantity grown in Egypt, and will therefore be always in demand at higher prices.

GIVE NORTH CAROLINA WHAT SHE DESERVES. We find going the rounds of the press a statement of the cotton crop of 1872-73 that does North Carolina manifest and signal injustice. The following is the statement.

Now these figures are grossly false. In the North Census, taken in 1870, North Carolina is credited with having produced 144,935 bales of cotton, and we doubt not that this is correct. If so, the above figures for the last two crops, must be woefully out-of-the-way.

THE WHEAT HARVEST. We find some figures in an exchange, which we reproduce. Wheat has failed to reap its accustomed harvest of what the wheat crop in England is 75,000,000 bushels—a falling off of one-fifth crop.
