Stokes' verdict is manslaughter in the third degree, and was sentenced to four years hard labor. Judge Davis said: In rendering this verdict, Stokes, the jury have exhausted and more than exhausted all mercy in your case. No appeal to this court can diminish the sentence from the highest penalty affixed by the statute in the degree in which you are convicted and, it is too light and apparently trifling as compared with the crime you have committed.

FROM FRANCE. PARIS, Oct. 30.

In the Basine trial to-day, Mr. Flahann, a messenger, testified that under fear of capture by the enemy he swallowed a dispatch which he was carrying from Thionville to Metz. The dispatch was recovered and delivered to the officers at headquarters in Metz, on the 29th of August, but was by them thrown into the fire unread. Lieut. Nogues swore that he fruitlessly attempted to deliver the Basine dispatch entrusted to him 23d of August by the Empress. He admitted after much prostration that he was also bearer of the dispatch to Gen. Bourbaki.

The failure of the Bank of English Directors to advance their rate of discount to-day caused a decline here in both gold and foreign exchange. No change in the monetary situation, call loans still being done at 7 per cent to 7 1/2 per cent. The associated banks to-day gained \$750,000 legal tenders. Fair activity in Railroad bonds at low prices. The stock market opened steady, but soon became weak and continued to decline until the close of the day, when an upward reaction set in. The decline ranged from 1 to 4 per cent throughout the day and the recovery up to two o'clock, from a fall to one and three quarters per cent.

FROM MASSACHUSETTS. FALL RIVER, Oct. 30.

A meeting of representatives from different cotton manufacturing corporations in this city, was held at the Board of Trade rooms last evening for the purpose of considering the question of reducing the working time in the mills. The various mills were represented. After hearing reports from different establishments and a discussion on the subject, it was voted that on and after Tuesday, November 4th, to run the mills on half time, four days of each week. All the mills, 39 in number, came into this arrangement, except the Merchants and Border City, which have contracts for the month of November, and the Robeson and Fall River Print Works Mills. These mills employ fourteen thousand operatives, and when in full operation their monthly pay rolls amount to about \$450,000.

A plan will be presented at the meeting to-morrow, accompanied with a detailed report of the situation of the firm, which will, it is believed, if carried out, render the embarrassment of A. & W. Sprague and Hoyt, Sprague & Co., of temporary duration.
