Noon Dispatches. Domestic News. FROM CANADA. MONTREAL, Nov. 19. The severest snap of the season.

FROM NEW JERSEY. TRENTON, Nov. 19. The Constitutional Convention has refused to exempt church and school property from taxation.

FROM PENNSYLVANIA. PHILADELPHIA, Nov. 19. The Grand Lodge of Odd Fellows oppose the abolition of the Ensignment branch order. The Grand Secretary was directed to inform sister Grand Lodges of its action.

FROM NEW YORK. NEW YORK, Nov. 19. The Liberal Republican General Committee have resolved that Cubans are entitled to belligerent rights, that it is obligatory on all nations to arrest volunteer atrocities; that the presence and forbearance on the part of the United States in the premises will be regarded by the people as pusillanimity.

The Tribune thinks all of the Virginia crew dead except 18 of 170. The verdict of the jury in Tweed's case is guilty on all counts. The defense took exceptions to none except on the general verdict, and moved the arrest of judgment on the ground of the want of jurisdiction; that the act of 1870 creating the law, was repealed by an act passed in 1873. The Court replied that it was a useless waste of time as the Court was convinced on this point. The defense remonstrated. Judge Davis replied that he had no intention of waiving counsel's feelings for the defense. The defense said the answers by the prosecution to points made by the defense were humiliating, the prosecution calling them trifling.

FROM OHIO. CLEVELAND, Nov. 19. Sixty small pox cases. It is increasing.

FROM MISSOURI. ST. LOUIS, Nov. 19. The Hogan and Allen fight was declared off; spectators heading the ring after the third round under the universal cry of souls, delivered by Allen.

FROM JAMAICA. KINROSS, Nov. 19. The United States steamer Aik, which was feared lost, arrived at Detroit.
