JUDGE TOURGEE'S LETTER—HE DENIES THE PENITENTIARY IMPROVEMENT.

Judge Tourgee in a long letter to the Cleveland Ledger, denies that he was ever in the penitentiary. But he does not deny that he has not merited that deception. The letter is called out by a speech from General Samuel F. Cary, made last October in Cleveland, Ohio, charging that His Honor, the Judge, was from the penitentiary. The Judge gives his pedigree and raising. He says: "He was born at Williamsfield, Ash-tabula county, Ohio. From Williamsfield it seems, he rotated in early life to Kingsville, Ohio. Then he rotated to New York to school; then back again to Ohio. Then he rotated to Niagara county, New York."

The geography student will see how easy it is for a man to escape from Niagara to Canada, but Tourgee says he was teaching school there, and we are willing to believe him. He belonged to a New York regiment, the 27th. In 1865, he settled in North Carolina. He does not tell whether he was at the burning of Columbus or the seeking of Hale's office, the Fayetteville Observer. It will be seen from extracts from the letter, how far Judge Tourgee can beat Jordan Stone's heavy corps of editors throwing billings-gate. Tourgee's judicial term expires soon, and we advise Stone to dismiss his editorial corps and engage Tourgee. He learned to blackguard about Niagara where they had to speak it loud or hear their utterances stoff in the roaring cataract.

Says Tourgee in his letter: "After the close of the war, it is true, I am guilty of three heinous offenses against the present associates of Mr. Cary. First, I encroached I had a right to live at the South; second, I chose to be a Republican, and third, I saw fit to accept an office at the hands of the people of the State. Of course I shared the fate of every one who had the temerity to do these things. All the infamy which unscrupulous and persistent lying could invent was heaped upon my name."

Defending carpet-baggers the letter says: "This is the experience of every Northern man who presumes to live at the South, and choose to be a Republican. It matters not how pure his life, or how unblemished his conduct may be, he must be split in the bias of calumny. The name of 'carpet-bagger' with all its attendant odium is bestowed upon him, and he is held responsible for all the evil which results from the conduct of his friends or his enemies. A half-dozen in a State are enough to excite suspicion of 'carpet-bagger' and twelve constitute positive tyranny. Like the printer's 'hell box,' his suppositions become the remorse of every convenient bit of iniquity not otherwise appropriated."

In part this is not true. It is not to be wondered at that the Southern man with hopes and aspirations blighted by the downfall of slavery and rebellion, educated to a hatred of the Yankee, counts himself a little better in birth and breeding than the North could possibly produce, regarding a member of the 'Republican party as a prius infamatus, it is not strange that he gives any credence to whatever tale of obloquy malice may invent. And this the average Southern Conservative does. He believes every infamy he hears of a Republican or a 'carpet-bagger' as firmly as he does the 'positive' creed. Thus and time alone can be relied upon to cure him, and when he is cured he will seem as surprised as if a miracle had been wrought in his mind and wonder that he could have believed such inherently improbable tales. Like the poor victims of that strange epidemic of despair and rage—the Ku-Klux machine—they will confess their error, and acknowledge that they look with horror on their own past acts. Such may say be forgiven."

There is among us here, no over, a class of rascals who live on the dead past alone—for whom there is no present consolation or future hope—who are so high that they can fall no further, whose highest motive is the gratification of malice—bitter, unrelenting, black, who can only serve their party by the imputation of such standards as they may still be able to derive. These men are mean enough and bad enough. The persons who should propose to vindicate the character that they had assumed by the means which the law affords, would not serve to illustrate the adage, 'one a beggar and another a leper.'"

But, however bad these men may be, they are infinitely above the jacks who feed upon the off of their prey—seeking, clinging, hypocrites, &c. &c. Mr. Cary's letter, in making this charge, is not showing a bit of the lowest character."

No one knows better than he that if it had been true, they would have raised hell and sifted the subject, to get the proof long ago. He not only knew that it was a lie, but he knew that it was a stain and scandal. He knew that the Raleigh Sentinel, Judge's principle, among political lies and defamations, found this tale which he has repeated, his best and infamously green that setting random of half truth and prejudice, and was obliged to retract it. We never said Judge Tourgee was in the penitentiary. When he was by General H. Cary. Judge Billy Shepherson, his reputation is so high that we can see a jail-bird from Ohio, and see a 'leper' in the penitentiary. Tourgee said

"they say" Hon. Mr. Henderson is indicted for stealing Dana mule. As to the truth of the charges brought by the one against the other republican, we know nothing. We only know they both deserve and have well merited places in the penitentiary. Tell us ladies and gentlemen to whom you will yield the palm for blackguarding—the Raleigh News or Judge Tourgee? Verily it is tight tooting between the two. The Judge has the advantage having travelled more, and lived on the Canada borders, and learned to blackguard in French and Dutch, after having graduated at the Ash-tabula stables, where he had instructions from the best "easing" teamsters.

CONSOLIDATION. We have been so nigh blackguarded out of our senses, that we have not had time to make suggestions to the Legislature upon the great consolidation question. We have not even had time to tell them what we know about railroads and mortgage bonds.

The "Mullet" or Newbern road was mortgaged at \$2,000 per mile, and the bonds sold for eighty cents in the dollar and less. The Tom Scott-Buford-Billy Smith mortgage of the North Carolina road is to be for \$18,000 per mile. This is too much. Money-lenders will say, there is risk to run. Five or six thousand dollars to the mile is enough, if you want the bonds to sell at par. The mortgage bonds of the North Carolina road are now at par and always were until \$180,000 of them fell into the hands Holden and our hero of finance, David Jenkins, who shut up his shop because Mr. Kemp Battle and the lawyers told him it was prudent.

Dave sold \$180,000 of these bonds at sixty cents in the dollar, to George W. Sweeney. After that sale, the bonds went back to par, and are at par to-day, unless Billy Smith sold some recently at less, to raise money for McAden to pay off his claims against the Western Road. At \$18,000 per mile, the mortgage on the North Carolina Road will give \$2,839,000. These bonds will sell at 80 or perhaps 65.

In eighteen months, Billy Smith and Buford will mortgage the McAden or Western Road at \$13,000 to the mile, and they will bring fifty or sixty, and they don't care which or what.

If you will mortgage, mortgage both roads. Billy Smith, acting for the State and corporation, has bought and paid part of the money for McAden's road, from Salisbury to Morganton, and given his bond for \$800,000, to be paid when the consolidation bill is passed, we suppose. Both roads being mortgaged at the rate of \$7,000 per mile, and bonds not allowed to sell at less than par, would give \$2,261,000.

All the roads of the State have been mortgaged, and none sold at par except the North Carolina Road. Her bonds are at par to-day, and a clause should be inserted in the bill forbidding a sale of the bonds except at par.

Not to do so, is to hand the road over to swindlers with a license to plunder as did Littlefield and Sweeney. The mortgage bonds of the North Carolina Road never sold except at par, save once; if they are at par to-day why not declare in the consolidation bill they should not be sold for less than par. The bonds of the road have been upon the market five years, and are in day at par. Let us legislate to keep them so, by a proviso in the bill that they shall not be sold at less than par. If the mortgage bonds of the North Carolina Road could go through the many financial crisis that have been upon the country, and maintain themselves as good as gold, why shall they not continue to do so? Why should it be if they do not? It will be the fault of this legislature, by not putting the brakes on the ring to be led by Buford, McAden, Billy Smith and Tom Scott.

JOURNALISTIC PROPRIETY. The Norfolk Virginian said the Raleigh papers, the News and Sentinel, were disgracing themselves and the State by the use of disgraceful terms, such as liar, scoundrel, coward, &c. And he calls upon them in the name of decency to cease. The News would not stop either for decency or the Virginian.

The Executive Committee of the Democratic party and members of the Legislature, censured on the latest language of the News and personal attacks of editors. The News was throwing its most choice billings-gate at us and had news boys with his belt of spit and running up and down the streets during the conversation services. A lot of respect the visitors and strangers in the city, who came to witness the final session at a Raleigh in North Carolina. We called for quarters, until the conversation services were over. Now that strange are out of the city, we may go on with his egg "baiting."

We would say, "hold, enough," on account of our city ladies and gentlemen, but they seem to each egg prying from other city papers. They have seen Gov. Holden, Gov. Caldwell, the Standard, the N. Page & Co., and the Long Ferry, put us in the same way, and they are a little used to it. So go on Mr. Stone, as it is to your taste.

FALSE ISSUE. The News denies that, paper is run by Sweeney, Tom Scott or Buford. We cannot remember to have charged that either one of these parties did so. We charged Buford with running the publisher of the News to wit: The Carolina. We charge that the News is run by a ring, or association of gentlemen, or the gentleman who furnishes the money, and money not his own, but belonging and

coming as we think from two rings. Instead of furnishing sixteen to twenty thousand dollars, we would not be surprised if the rings had furnished thirty thousand dollars. We have never asked the editor of the News, and our office consists in calling for a squire to investigate who runs the concern. As Richard called aloud and offered his kingdom for a horse. So we call aloud for a squire, and offer our last subscriber for one. A squire, a squire! at our expense, to show who runs the ring organ. One of the answers to this call is the News publishing our petition for pardon to Andy Johnston, to show we were opposed to peaceable secession and every measure that lead to it. We do not care to discuss these old issues. We were whipped on them after fighting the friends of secession just as we to-day fight radicals. The people of North Carolina are grieving to-day that we did not whip the fight in 1860-'61, and prevent secession. Jordan Stone will find that the whole people of the State are with us on this old issue, as they are with the new.
