Bishop Lyman,

As this gentleman is a stranger to North Carolinians, we have thought that some of the facts of his life would be of interest to our readers. We svail ourself of an extended account of his consecration and a sketch of his life, that appeared in the Upiscopal Recorder.

Theodore B. Lyman was born on the 27th November, 1815, in Brighton, near Boston, Massachusetts. His father was a Presbyterian clergyman-a graduate of Yale College, in the same class with Dr. Beecher, the father of the present Beech ers. His early life was mostly spent in New York and New Jersey in various schools. One year he was engaged in mercantile life, before he entered Hamilton College, from which he graduated in 1887. During his collegiste course the only Episcopal student in the College was his roommate, and in frequent discussions, the claims of the Episcopal Church were so forcibly presented by his companion, that he was led to a change of his Theotogical views, and in the autumn of 1837 he entered the General Theological Seminars in New York at the age of 22.

He was ordained Descon by Bishop Whittingham on Sept. 20th 1840, in St.

Paul's Church, Baltimore. In October of the same year, he was sent to St. Joan's Church, Hagerstown, Md., as Deacon and on he 10th of December he was advanced to the Priest hood. Two days afterwards be was instituted as Rector of the Parish. It was during his Recto ship of St. Joho's, that he conceived the idea of buying the ancestral residence of Mejor Ringgold for a Diocesan College known as St. James, The success which crowned his efforts is known to all in the Church. He was Rector of St. John's for ten years. On the 21st of April, 1850, he was installed Rector of Trinity Church, Pittaburg. Assuming at once the charge, he began the work of Church Extension, St. Peter's Church, Pittsburg, was built and made a separate Parish at a cost of \$60,000, and was con sidered in those days the finest church in the West. By his efforts, missions were established and churches butit in Birmingham, Chartiers and New Brighton, Through his instrumentality mainly, was founded the Church Home for Children, and Aged Women which is now a strong and dourshing institution with a large property of its own. He is the third successive Rector of this Parish that has been made Bishop, viz ;
