FROM SPAIN
A decree was promulgated to-day suspending constitutional guarantees and putting in force throughout Spain the laws of 1870 for the maintenance of public order. Decrees are also published authorizing the Government to take possession of the printing press of the 'Union'...

It is rumored here in Spanish circles that Gen. Dornagueta has been ordered to relieve Gen. Moriena, in command of the army of the North that Admiral Topete has declined the ministry of Marine, and that another military movement is on foot in Madrid for the control of the Government.

FROM NEW ORLEANS
NEW ORLEANS, Jan. 6. Gov. Kellogg, in the course of his message, says the total debt of the State is \$24,283,396. Some of this was of doubtful legality, and was being tested in courts. The State had tried to pay interest on this whole amount, and had done so up to date, but could do so no longer without maintaining a rate of taxation which was almost confiscation.

HAVANA, Jan. 6. The Home Government has granted, without restriction, the extraordinary powers demanded by the Captain General. The Conservative party here is highly delighted with the change of government at Madrid. The boatmen of the bay here struck for payment in gold, and communication between the town and shipping is very difficult for passengers.
