CALENDAR. House to prevent the selling of tree in Bladwell cove, Guilford county, was put on its third reading.

House bill on its third reading to allow the commissioners of Anson county to levy a special tax not to exceed \$12,000, passed its third reading.

The bill to authorize the Governor to appoint special terms of the Superior court for the trial of both criminal and civil cases passed its second reading.

Senate bill supplemental to and explanatory of all corporations acts passed its second reading.

The following bills on second reading were laid on the table: Senate bill to amend the chapters in Battle's Revisal entitled "Widows and Orphans" and "Landlord and Tenant."

SPECIAL ORDER. The bill to enlarge the Insane Asylum and to provide for the better government of the same, came up at 12 o'clock as the special order.

On motion of Mr. Murphy, its further consideration was postponed until next Tuesday at 12 o'clock, and the bill ordered to be printed.

The bill to provide for the support of the Lunatic Asylum came up as special order at 12 o'clock. The bill appropriates \$65,000 for the present year.

After remarks by Messrs. Ellis, Murphy, Humphrey, Worth, Norwood, Morehead of Rockingham, and others, on motion of the Senator from Columbus, the bill was made special order for 12 o'clock on Saturday next.

The bill to provide for the support of the Institution for the Deaf and Dumb and the Blind came up as special order at 1 o'clock.

The bill appropriates \$40,500 for the present year.

An animated debate sprung up which was participated in by Senators Murphy, Waring, Ellis, Worth, Harris, Avera, Norwood, Scott, Merriam.

Mr. Waring offered an amendment appropriating \$20,000 instead of \$10,000. The amendment was lost—yeas 11, nays 23.

The bill passed its second reading—yeas 30, nays 8.

Mr. Murphy moved that this bill be made the special order for to-morrow at 11 o'clock.

By Mr. McCauley, a bill to punish illegal marriages. Referred.

On motion of Mr. Avera, the Senate adjourned until to-morrow morning at 11 o'clock.
