MADRID.—An aggressive movement of Carlists has served to arouse a feeling on the part of the people to aid the government by all means in their power to crush the insurrection. Contributions of money and clothing are pouring in, and all the theatres in this city have given performances in aid of the cause. Telegrams have been received from provincial autho-

rities offering moral and material sup-

port.

The latest advices from Bilbao report no change in the situation. The Carlists keep up their bombardment, about two hundred shells are thrown into the city daily.

LARGE RAILROAD FIRE IN BOS-
TON.

BOSTON.—A fire broke out this morn-

ton. The loss will reach \$100,000, of which the Eastern Railroad have no in-

exceed this amount as it is very difficult to estimate the value of the freight de-

stroyed. A large building composed of

brick and wood, was thoroughly gutted.

The fire was caused by the breaking of a

package of oil vitriol.
