RALEIGH, N. C., April 23, 1874. There was a special meeting of the Board of City Commissioners to-day...

There was a special meeting of the Board of City Commissioners to-day, Messrs. Battle, Clawson, Ellison, Gorman, Johnson, Jones, Peirce, Ricka, White, present. His Honor Mayor Whitaker, presiding.

The petition of numerous citizens of the Western Ward protesting against the Ordinance, granting right of way to the Raleigh & Carolina Road through certain streets of that Ward, was read.

Whereupon, Mr. Gorman, moved to reconsider said Ordinance, which was adopted. Mr. Battle, moved to strike out of the Ordinance, the name of P. B. Hawkins, and insert therein "the words any person," their associates and agents, who may obtain contracts in C. S. Court House and P. O. Building, and further to strike out provision 4th of said Ordinance to wit: that the rails shall not be above the surface above the level of the Street.

And as amendatory that said Ordinance the further provision, that said provision shall not be employed on the Rail Road. Mr. Gorman moved to postpone indefinitely with the following result: Ayes—Clawson, Ellison, Gorman, Jones, Peirce, Ricka, Johnson, and White; Nays—Messrs. Battle and Whitaker.

Whereas the lands of the North Carolina Agricultural Society near said city known as the "New Farm Grounds," have been heretofore conveyed in trust to secure the payment of ten thousand dollars, borrowed of the North Carolina State Agricultural Society, and there remains a large indebtedness incurred by said Society in improving the same, and providing laborers and mechanics fees, and other expenses, and it is necessary to provide for such indebtedness by further loans to be secured by mortgage or deed in trust of said lands, to which the assets of said City of Raleigh, is requisite. Now therefore,

Be it ordained, That the North Carolina Agricultural Society have full power and authority to convey the lands aforesaid by mortgage or deed in trust, in order to secure a further loan of money, not exceeding ten thousand dollars interest thereon, in addition to the sum for which the first mortgage was given, or, in trust of said lands, to borrow a sum not exceeding twenty thousand dollars, and to use the same for the purpose aforesaid, and to secure the same, and to pay the same, at such time, after two years, as the Society may deem proper, with interest payable annually or semi-annually, after such time, and to secure the same by a mortgage or deed in trust, conveying said lands, in fee of which mortgage, he borrowed or derived from sale of said lands, so much as is necessary, shall be applied to the payment and discharge of the obligations incurred by the first loan aforesaid, and of the conveyance made to secure the same, and the residue of said moneys shall be applied to the other indebtedness of said Society as aforesaid, and the proper officers and authorities of said city are directed in its name, and on its behalf, to execute any deed or writing required to carry this Ordinance with effect, provided, however, that said mortgage or deed in trust aforesaid, shall not be liable in foreclosure on the lands therein conveyed to the said Society until two years after its execution.

The ordinance was adopted. The vote stood as follows: Messrs. Battle, Ellison, Gorman, Johnson, Jones, Peirce, White and Ricka, voting affirmatively. Mr. Clawson negatively.
