Holden, we hope all of the friends of Mr. Pesud will work with us and elect him as Mayor of our city.

**MEETING OF THE CONSERVATIVES OF RALEIGH TOWNSHIP.**—A meeting of the Conservatives of Raleigh Township was held to-day in the Court House. Mr. M. Harrison was appointed Chairman, and Messrs. Woodson and Bragg, requested to act as Secretaries. The Chairman explained the object of the meeting—it being to

appoint Delegates to the County Convention, and speak at some length in regard to the call for the Mass Convention by the County Executive Committee. Mr. F. H. Busbee explained the call of the Committee. Further discussion ensued in which Messrs. Ross Sparks and C. M. Busbee participated.

Dr. Moxley introduced a resolution to best for the several townships to hold meetings as they are doing, and appoint Delegates in the old way. But upon further explanation of Mr. F. H. Busbee, who agreed to call another meeting of the County Executive Committee, to take into consideration the objections urged, Dr. Moxley's resolution was withdrawn. Mr. W. P. Batchelor offered the following, which was adopted:

**Resolved,** That the Chairman appoint twenty delegates to represent Raleigh Township in the County Convention of 23rd of May, and resolved further that all Democrats who are present at said Convention from Raleigh Township shall be considered as delegates thereto.

The Chairman was instructed to appoint delegates at his leisure, which will probably appear in Monday's issue. On motion the meeting then adjourned.

**THE RALLYING MEETING OF THE REPUBLICANS LAST NIGHT.**—The Holden Republicans held a rallying meeting last night at Metropolitan Hall. John T. Ball, Mail Agent on the N. C. R. R., was called to preside, and Handy Lockhart was honored with the Secretaryship over the meeting.

James H. Harris was the first speaker. He said in part that this was a great reform movement, which he so much desired to see carried out. Designing parties had tried to obstruct it, they had said there was something anti-republican in it, and that the cry of Democracy had been raised, which he denounced as false, and that some of his party had started to read him out of that party, he couldn't be read out, &c. He urged his hearers to go to the polls, and cast their votes for Holden and the other Republican nominees.

Explained the Prohibition Question, which had nothing to do with the city election, and predicted that they would surely carry the Eastern and Western Wards. Pitched into Tim Lee about rearranging the Middle Ward Republican Convention, and wound up with an exhortation to the faithful to vote their ticket. During his remarks he went for Friday Jones, who had been talking about him. He said Friday was a quarrelsome old fellow, would be found locking horns with the devil, when he went below—that out of 265 days, there was only one Good Friday, and Raleigh was cursed with an Every Day Friday.

**A FAMOUS APPLE TREE.**—There is an apple tree standing in a lot adjoining the house of Rev. J. W. Center, at Huntersville, Pocahontas county, West Virginia, which has become historical, marking the spot where General R. E. Lee pitched his first tent in the late war. Early in the summer of 1861 Gen. Lee was ordered to the command of the forces in West Virginia. Leaving Richmond he came to Warm Springs the first day, and on the day following reached Huntersville, where for the first time in the war, he bivouacked on the tented field, selecting the aforementioned apple tree, which stands on a hill overlooking the town, as the place where his tent should be pitched.

It is a singular coincidence that General Lee should have commenced his military career under an apple tree among the mountains of West Virginia, and have closed that brilliant career by capitulating to Grant under an apple tree at Appomattox.
