MADRID—New Ministers sworn in—

THE LEGISLATURE CALLS ON THE PRES-
IDENT FOR POSSESSION OF THE STATE
HOUSE AND OTHER PROPERTY. BAXTER
GOVERNOR—AMEN.
LETTER ROCK, May 14th.—Both Houses
met this morning and adopted the fol-
lowing joint resolution:

WHEREAS, The Legislature of Arkansas
has convened a quorum at each House
being present, and whereas the Capital of
our State is occupied by armed and con-
tending forces, and whereas the State
House is now in possession of armed troops
therefore

It is resolved by the General Assembly
of the State of Arkansas, That the Pres-
ident of the United States be and he is
hereby requested to put this Legislature
in possession of the legislative halls, and
that the public property of the State House
be placed under the supervision and
control of this body, the legal custodians
thereof whilst in session, and that he
make such order for the disposition of
aid armed and contending forces as will
more perfectly protect the State against
domestic violence, and insure this body
protection; and that a duly certified copy
of this resolution be at once transmitted
to the President of the United States.
