FROM WASHINGTON.

Congressional Proceedings—Defeat of the Supplementary Civil Rights Bill in the House by "no thirds" voting to vote—Billy Smith Votes With the Democrats Against the Bill.

WASHINGTON, May 25.—SENATE.—Mr. Scott called up the bill supplementary to the act to incorporate the Texas Pacific Railroad. He stated that the bill was designed to enable the Company to execute a mortgage upon the portion of its road already completed.

Mr. Edmunds moved an amendment that nothing in this act shall be construed to have the effect to entitle said corporation to any other or further rights to public lands, or in any other respect as against the United States than such as it is entitled to by law which was in effect at the time of the passage of the act.

to the Constitution: Article 16. If any State shall fail to maintain a common school system under which all persons between the ages of five and eighteen years not incapacitated for the same, shall receive free of charge such elementary education as Congress may prescribe, Congress shall have power to establish therein such a system, and cause the same to be maintained at the expense of such State. Referred to the Judiciary Committee.

House.—Bills were introduced confining pre-emption and homestead rights in Alabama.

By Gen. Sheldon, a bill to refund the cotton tax.

By Crossland, of Kentucky, a bill to revise the act of 1864 providing for the payment to loyal owners of negroes drafted or mustered into the army of the United States. It proposes the appointment of a commission to investigate all such claims, and to allow in each case the sum of \$300, as provided in said act, which was suspended in 1867.

By Mr. Harris, of Virginia, a bill to restore to the pension rolls the names of pensioners of the Mexican war stricken therefrom for disability.

Motions to suspend the rules and take up the supplementary Civil Rights bill and the Currency bill were defeated, two thirds not voting in the affirmative. Vote on civil rights was 153 to 84, not two thirds. The following Republicans voted with the Democrats: Braamberg, of Alabama, Butler, of Tennessee, Lowndes, Senator, of Virginia, Strat, of Minnesota, Ambler Smith, of Virginia, W. A. Smith, of North Carolina, Thomas, of Virginia, Thornburg, of Tennessee. The defeat of the supplementary civil rights bill in the House to-day is not a finality. To be sure the Senate bill cannot be got at except under a suspension of the rules by a two-thirds vote, and that, as shown by the action of the House to-day, cannot be secured; but the Judiciary Committee, under its leave to report at any time, can report a bill which is a perfect copy of the Senate bill, and this can be passed by a simple majority and sent over to the Senate and there be acted on.

In that way the supplementary Civil Rights bill may find itself in the President's hands. As amendatory tariff and internal revenue bill was reported in the House to-day. It contains the following clause: "Any farmer or planter who may at the place of production tobacco of his own growth at retail directly to the consumer to any amount not exceeding one hundred dollars annually."

TO THOSE WHOM IT INTERESTS. New York, May 25.—The following is an extract from a telegram received on Saturday by his son from General J. Watson Webb, who is in Europe: "Let every friend of Secretary Seward's independence in relation to the Caroline affair be sent to the House. It will correctly demonstrate what follows: The claimant in the Caroline case proposed that certain Brazilians should collect the claim and receive all over \$350,000. In 1866 I submitted a proposition to Secretary Seward for his approval. In 1867 the claim was paid after standing 20 years. I sent \$35,000 to Seward to get her with claimant's original authority to pay balance to his agents, which I did. Secretary Seward formally approved, saying: 'You have shown much energy and sagacity in adjustment of this claim. Five years afterwards Secretary Fish and Attorney General Akerman decided that Brazil was not liable. That Polk, Buchanan, Marcy, Cass and Seward were all wrong, and I was called upon to refund the money paid to claimant's agents. I will be at home as soon as my health will permit.'"

THE NORTHERN EDITORS FRAGMENTING HONOR IN ALABAMA. MONTGOMERY, May 25.—The New York editors have had occasion after occasion all through Alabama, and are delighted with that State and the people. The greatest of the series was given them here. They leave at 7 this morning via South & North & Selma, Rome & Dalton roads for Atlanta, so as to take in iron fields and furnaces on that route. They leave Atlanta Tuesday evening via Great Kenesaw route for Chattanooga, and thence to Lynchburg and Washington. Ten or twelve Alabama editors attend them by invitation of B. W. Wren, Agent of Kenesaw route, to New York and Alabama associations.

DECORATION DAY IN THE NORTH. WASHINGTON, May 25.—Senator Patterson has addressed a letter to the Secretary of War, deprecating the orders heretofore issued forbidding the decoration of Confederate graves, as a memorial day at Arlington, and urging that the order, if standing, be revoked, or if temporary, that it be not renewed.

HARRISBURG, May 25.—Governor Hartman has signed the bill making decoration day a legal holiday.

RESOLUTIONS ADOPTED BY THE STATE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE OF THE DEMOCRATIC-CONSERVATIVE PARTY—PLAN OF ORGANIZATION. RESOLUTIONS. Resolved, That we deeply sympathize with the people of the West in their want of railroad facilities, and pledge ourselves to use every available means to secure the early completion of their projected lines.

Resolved, That the Republican party having despoiled the State, millions of dollars heretofore appropriated for railroad purposes, is unworthy of confidence, and that experience justifies the conclusion that if that party should be again entrusted with the administration of our internal improvements, its leaders would again prove recreant to the sacred trust, and would divert the public fund to their private purposes.

Resolved, That the policy dictates the adoption of such measures as may be necessary to increase the educational advantages of the children of North Carolina.

Resolved, That we earnestly recommend to the members of the Democratic-Conservative Party to discourage independent candidates for office, and to support only those candidates who are members of the party.

Resolved, That we tender to the friends of Free Government our sincere congratulations at the triumph of the great principles of the Constitution as illustrated by the Democratic successes in the recent State and local elections.

PLAN OF ORGANIZATION. The following plan of the Democratic-Conservative party was adopted: 1. The Executive Committee for the State shall consist of at present appointed, and shall have all the powers heretofore conferred upon it.

5. Nominations for county officers and members of the General Assembly shall be made by county conventions; for town and township officers, by town and township conventions. For members of Congress and Judicial officers, by the District Conventions.
