FROM NEW YORK.

New York, Oct. 22.

The great locomotive works are now busy about their inability to fill the famous contract for fifty locomotives. The work has suspended. Liability one quarter of a million. A large surplus is claimed, but it is unavailable, and the future of the Company depends upon the claim insurance.

The two suspenders will discharge all employees who adhere to the Cooper's Union. A prolonged fight between the bosses and coopers is apprehended. Five thousand workmen are involved in the lock out.

FROM WASHINGTON.

Washington, Oct. 22.

It may be stated that the Austin, Brownsville, and Calvert postmasters are safe. Jewett finds nothing tangible against them. Those at Galveston, Houston, and Dallas go certainly. The Secretary of the Treasury will not say certainly until after a consultation with the President, but the indications point to, with one or two exceptions, including the Collector at Brownsville. A general clearing out will soon won some of the officials of Attorney General Williams hold their places by a loose tenure. The feeling among the Secretaries seems to be that they have been induced to place in office persons deficient in morale and manners and they propose to unseat. After Texas, South Carolina and Alabama come up, there will be great slaughter.
