**MURDER AT JOHNSTON.**—A passenger on the Fayetteville train observed at Johnston a burnt shanty and the charred remains of two bodies. **STAMPS ON CHECKS.**—The law requires every check on a bank to be stamped with its requirements, neglected this. Many of our citizens have habitually, either from ignorance of the law or inattention to its requirements, neglected this. An official agent is now traveling from city to city investigating the subject, and all found neglecting to conform to the provisions of the law will be summoned into the United States Court and fined. As one half the fee paid goes to the agent, there is no mistaking the fact that he will perform his duties to the utmost. It will save annoyance and expense if all who have business at any bank will attend to the caution we now give. As every man's name is on his checks, there is no chance of escape, if the agent, when he makes official investigation in Raleigh, should lay information against any one. Stamp your checks.
