Only thirty days were given to the peo ple to discuss and consider the Constitution before they were called upon to vote upon it. Not one in fifty read it before voting on it. We insist that the enemie of Convention must give some other rea son for opposing it, then fear that the people are not with them on the question, and that we might endanger the Presidential election of 1776.

The liberty and safety of the people of North Carelina depends more upon a good State Constitution than upon who is President of the United States. Give us a Constitution made by our own people and let the Presidential election take care of itself.
