CONGRESSIONAL AND OTHER MATTERS.

WASHINGTON, December 22.—There was a full but brief routine of the Cabinet to day.

Nominations.—M. J. Grady, Collector of the Third Louisiana District, and many Northern positions.

Recess is probable. Some 35 members of Congress obtained leave of absence to-day, and others will go without leave.

The Committee, however, in the meantime will continue work, so as to put it in shape for prompt action after the holidays.

HOUSE.—There were many resolutions of enquiry. Bill authorizing Supreme Court of District to proceed with its jury business, passed.

House went into committee on naval appropriations. A large number of the members have obtained leave of absence.

SENATE.—Seven States petition for Board of Commissioners to consider improvement of the Ohio river and its tributaries.

Adjournment resolution upon objection of West, of Louisiana, went over till tomorrow.

Finance bill, substantially as reported by caucus heretofore telegraphed, passed at a late hour to-night. Vote, 32 to 14. A party vote.

MISCELLANEOUS ITEMS. PHILADELPHIA, Dec. 22.—The Board of Trade passed the resolution looking to the restraint of everybody from inquisitorial and unreasonable searches into the private affairs of commercial firms, mining or manufacturing or other business men upon any pretence whatever.

TAKETON, N. J., Dec. 22.—There were three children drowned here by this ice. New York, Dec. 22.—A steamer supposed to be one of the New Orleans and Havana packets, bound for New York, went ashore on Barnegat Shoals at 6 o'clock this morning. They are now throwing cotton over board, and the authorities are unable to ascertain her name.

HAVANA, Dec. 22.—Advices from Venezuela report a battle eighty-eight hours long. Eight hundred were killed and wounded. Both parties claim the advantage.

NEW YORK, Dec. 22.—The writ of habeas corpus in the case of Wm. M. Tweed was dismissed to-day by Judge Barrett, and the prisoner remanded to custody.

BARNEGAT, Dec. 22.—The South Carolina flies easy, and it is thought that as soon as more freight be jettisoned she will float. All the passengers were safely landed.

BOSTON, Dec. 22.—The courtesies of the city were tendered to King Kalakaua. WATERTOWN, MASS., Dec. 22.—The Blooded Metallic Art Works were burned. Loss \$35,000.

BERLIN, Dec. 22.—The orders to withdraw the German vessels from the Spanish coast were countermanded. The Carlist must explain the attack upon the German brig Gustave.

BALTIMORE, Dec. 22.—Gen. Teuch Zeligman is dead, aged 65 years. The Graduated West Point Classes Jury in the Gass perjury case disagreed and was discharged.

MILWAUKEE, Dec. 22.—J. P. Laird's saw mill boiler exploded, killing 15 and wounding 20.

PARIS, Dec. 22.—Prince Alphonse replying to certain Spanish addresses says that monarchy alone can terminate the disorder, and the people of Spain have agreed and have declared him the only rightful heir.

FOREIGN NEWS. CONSTANTINOPLE, Dec. 22.—The lightning exploded a powder magazine in Scutari, and portions of the city wall was prostrated. Many houses demolished, and two hundred persons were killed.
