It is the 10th section of the consolidation bill which excludes any man guilty of embezz'ement or any man who has refused to answer questions concerning his connection with the road for fear of criminal prosecution, This is the section : "Toat no person shall be a commissioner, director or general manager who has heretofore or may hereafter decline to testify before any committce, legislative or otherwise, or before any court of competent jurisdiction, in regard to any matter touching or growing out of very early next summer when all fruits of any railroad, or while acting in any other public fiduciary capacity on the ground, that if he were to testify he would criminate himself, or any kindred or like grounds, or who has been convicted of embezzlement, or who has failed to return to the treasury any special tax bonds as required by aw." Tois section has been accepted by the stockholders and it is now a port of the charter, and should not be repealed. Billy Smith is not named, but any man who has been guilty of embezzlement or who has refused to answer questions for fear of criminating higself is excluded from office, and he ought to be.
