THE ELECTIONS.

NEW HAVEN, Conn., April 6.
Gov. Ingerson's game was chiefly in New Haven and Hartford counties, the city of New Haven alone giving an increase of about 1,500 votes over his majority in this city last year. There was a largely decreased prohibition vote, the total in the State being about 1,200 to 8,600 votes last year. The Democratic majority in the House is about 100.

DECISION OF THE COURT OF CLAIMS IN FAVOR OF A NORTH CAROLINA LADY.

WASHINGTON, April 6.
The Court of Claims has decided the case of Sophia B. Moore, a widow, against the United States Patent Agent, having leased or rented the lands and houses of her late father in North Carolina, as abandoned property, during the civil war.

The Court says the right of action, given by the act of March 12th, 1863, applies to rents collected and paid into the Public Treasury under the provisions of the act of July, 1862, by treasury agents appointed by virtue of the first section of the former act, and the claimant is therefore entitled to recover for rents, but the right of action given by the act of March 12th, 1863, does not apply to the proceeds of the property which was captured on land by military and naval forces of the United States and removed into a loyal State by said forces, and libelled in a District Court before passage of the act of July 17th, 1862, and which was sold and the proceeds thereon paid into the Public Treasury before the passage of the act.

FROM MARYLAND.

ANNAPOLIS, Md., April 6.

The statement telegraphed in regard to the unfortunate disturbance at the election here yesterday afternoon, is in the main correct. A number of most respectable and influential citizens were at the polls at the time, and all agree that the negroes were aggressors, and it is positively asserted that Williams, who commenced the firing, was first knocked down by a colored man, and while down and was being assaulted, drew his pistol and fired two shots, both taking off.

Afterwards the second assault was made by a negro upon a white man with a cudgel, and an indiscriminate firing between the blacks and whites took place.

Two white men and eight negroes being shot, of the latter, Wm. Dorsey was killed and seven others wounded.

The disturbance was finally quelled by the whites of both parties effectually interfering to cause a cessation, after which the negroes retired. Otherwise they would have been followed by an exasperated crowd, and more serious consequences would have followed.
