THE CANDIDATES FOR CONVENTION.

Jon Turner has been buying himself this week with an effort to get indictments for libel issued against the Daily News for charging that he received money from Boston, to change his view on the Gage question. Some bills were drawn and sent to the Grand Jury. The Grand Jury to day returned in every instance not a fruit bill.

These days Orange County expresses her opinion of the character of Jon Turner. His indecent and libeling attempt by which he claims to have a nomination for Convention last Tuesday has excited intense disgust and deep seated dissatisfaction among all classes and in all sections of the county.

Hardly a word of truth in this dispatch. It is as false as the dispatch about Miss Armstrong, or the apology that Mr. N. B. Brightman had pecuniary interest in her election. No bill was sent to the Grand Jury.

They insist on Major Patterson running, but the Major says no. They insist on other Democrats running, and they say no.

A "Revenue Democrat" is one in full fellowship with its party, but ready to take office under Radicals or as an independent candidate, when he fails in obtaining a nomination.

Hillsboro, like most towns in the State, has some Democrats of this kind. Neither Major Patterson or his true friends are among them. We suggest to the Revenue Democrats of Hillsboro to hold mass-meetings in each township, instead of trying to get out independent candidates. Let them appeal from the Convention to the people assembled in mass from each township.
