Resolved, That further burials than those now existing shall be made on any lots until it shall be paid for or secured and on lots where no burials now exist; no burial shall be made until such lots be paid for or secured.

No Director shall give an order for purchase of lots, or for inments unless the same is accompanied by the cash.
