THE CONSTITUTIONAL CONVENTION.

FIRST DAYS PROCEEDINGS.

A DEAD LOCK—ROBESON COUNTY DELEGATES SEATED.

At 12 M., the Convention was called to order by Judge Settle, Associate Justice of the Supreme Court.

Mr. Turner wanted to know by what right the chairman pro tem ordered delegates elected...
