In spite of a cold drizzling rain, this has been the biggest day in the history of the fair. From seven in the morning, the crowds commenced pouring out to the grounds.

The grounds were alive, and a din was terrific. Engines rattling and screeching. All sorts of machinery a whirring and rattling. Vehicles by hundreds whirling and clattering.

FIRST DAY—Wednesday, Nov. 17. First Race—Trial purse \$150; second horse, \$50. A dash of 3/4 of a mile. For all ages, with one hundred pounds on each.

Second Race—And-o-Korah stakes for two year olds \$100, \$25 entrance, P. P. Half mile heat; second horse \$50 out of the stake. Three to fill.

Third Race—Club purse \$150; \$50 to second horse. One and a half mile dash. Weight for age.

SECOND DAY—Thursday, Nov. 18. First Race—Club purse \$125; \$25 to second horse. Mile dash.

Second Race—Central Hotel stakes—mile heats—\$25 entrance, P. P. \$300 added by the Central Hotel. Three to fill.

Third Race—Railroad stakes—two mile heats—\$50 entrance—half forfeit, \$500 added by the Railroad entering Charlotte. Three to fill.
