Mr. Burge was a member of Co. G, 47th N. C. T., during the late war, and was a gallant soldier. He leaves a wife and two young children.

UNVEILING OF THE JACKSON STATUE

GRAND DEMONSTRATION AND IMPROVING CHROMES.

Yesterday was a memorable day in the annals of Virginia. Richmond witnessed one of the grandest demonstrations that has ever taken place in the south, commemorative of the unveiling of the statue, a tribute of foreign admiration, of one of the greatest in the army of great men which the Old Dominion has given to the world. The entire city glittered with flags, evergreens and all sorts of appropriate decorations, and the streets were thronged with crowds drawn from all quarters to witness the splendid pageant.

At an early hour the principal streets began to present an animated appearance, the crowds gathering steadily until the procession moved, by which time the sidewalks along the route of march were crowded with surging masses, and every available place where a view could be had filled with spectators.

The procession occupied one hour and a half passing a given point, moving rapidly, and was composed of all the city military, infantry and artillery, visiting companies from Norfolk, Petersburg, Charlottesville, Staunton, Williamsburg and North Carolina, the corps of cadets of the Virginia Military Institute, with their battery, the cadets of the Agricultural and Mechanical college at Blacksburg, Virginia, members of many commands of the late war, including those of the famous Stonewall Brigade, the Catholic societies of Richmond, the students of Richmond college, singing societies, &c., besides a long cortege of carriages and other vehicles containing many distinguished individuals. Gen. Joseph E. Johnston was chief marshal and Gen. Harry Heth his principal assistant.

The colored organizations did not put in an appearance. Arriving at the capitol, the procession was massed in the vicinity of the veiled statue on the platform from which the oration was to be delivered, when, after prayer by Bishop Doggett, of the Methodist Episcopal church, South, Gov. Kemper made an introductory address in which he spoke in feeling terms of the occasion and in eulogy of Jackson. In one of his references to this tribute to the memory of a great man he said: "Let it endure as a perpetual expression of that world-wide sympathy with noble a gift from Great Britain to Virginia, and let its preservation attest the gratitude of the commonwealth to those great-hearted gentlemen of England who originated and procured it as a tribute to the memory of her son."

He concluded by introducing Rev. Dr. M. D. Hoge, of the Presbyterian church, as the orator of the day. Dr. Hoge, after an eloquent exordium, in which he alluded to the hallowed memories suggested by the occasion and the inspiring scenes before him, discussed what he considered three elements of the secret of Jackson's power and influence; first, in the fact that he was the incarnation of those heroic qualities which fit his possessor to lead and command men and which, therefore, always attract the admiration, kindle the imagination and arouse the enthusiasm of the people; second, his was the greatness which comes without being sought for his own sake, the unconquerable greatness which results from self-sacrifice and supreme devotion to duty; third, the purity and elevation of his character as a servant of the most high God. Dr. Hoge eloquently illustrated and enforced these points by striking incidents in the life of the great chieftain.

The oration was frequently interrupted by enthusiastic applause. As the last words of the orator died away, the veiling of the monument was suddenly withdrawn, and amid the thundering cheers of the multitude, the firing of musketry and booming of cannon, the bronze figure of Jackson emerged the game of the assembled thousands.

Gen. Page, of Norfolk, introduced to the crowd Gen. Jackson's only child, a little girl of thirteen, who was received with deafening and continued cheers. The ceremonies were concluded by the singing of Luther's grand anthem, "A castle of strength is our Lord."

At night the city was brilliantly illuminated. THE COMPETITIVE EXAMINATION.—At the hour of going to press the competitive examination at Levey's academy for the West Point cadetship, from this congressional district, had not concluded.
