## A List of ACTS passed by the General Assembly of North-Carolina, at their Session held at Raleigh, in 1802.

1. An act granting additional elections in the county of Sampson for other purposes.
2. For the better regulation of the town of Hillsborough.
3. To alter the place of holding the Battalion Muster and Election in the county of Bladen.
4. To amend an act passed last session of the General Assembly for the better regulation of the town of Wayneborough.
5. To establish a separate election at the house of Daniel Smith in the county of Cumberland.
6. To empower the Wardens of the poor for the counties of Martin and Robeson, to lay and collect an additional poor tax.
7. To fix the permanent residence of the Governor of this State.
8. To ratify and confirm the proceeding of the Entry-taker in the county of Ashe.
9. To amend the sixth section of an act passed at Raleigh in the year 1801, entitled "An act to amend the several land laws of this State."
10. To invest the property of a Bridge or Causeway through the dismal swamp from Camden to Currituck county, in Frederick B. Sawyer, for the term of twenty years.
11. To amend the several land laws in this State so far as respects surveys being made and returned into the Secretary's office.
12. For the better regulation of the town of Halifax.
13. To repeal in part an act passed in the year 1785, entitled "An act to empower the Justices of Hertford and Tyrrell counties to establish free ferries in said counties, and lay a tax for defraying the charges of the same."
14. To amend an act passed at the last session of the General Assembly of the State of North-Carolina, entitled "An act to open and make navigable Fishing Creek, from the mouth thereof as far as practicable."
15. To establish Fairs in the town of Halifax.
16. To pardon and restore to credit Jesse Dawkins, Richmond county.
17. To pardon and restore to credit Zach Stallings of the county of Johnston.
18. To repeal an act passed in the year 1796, so far as respects the county of Perquimans, entitled "An act making compensation to the owners of outlawed and executed slaves, for the counties of Bladen, Halifax, Granville, Cumberland, Perquimans, Beaufort and Pitt."
19. To establish an Academy in the town of Wadeborough in Anson county.
20. To grant a separate election and battalion muster to the inhabitants of Wayne county.
21. To compel the clerk of Surry county court to keep his office at or within two miles of the court-house.
22. To amend an act passed in 1800, directing the manner of proceeding against the several officers therein mentioned.
23. Making further provision for the redemption of the certificate debt of this State.
24. Prescribing the duty, and directing the manner of appointing port wardens for the port of Wilmington.
25. For altering the time of holding the two separate elections in the county of Stokes.
26. To authorize David Jones

- late Sheriff of New-Hanover county to collect the arrears of taxes for the year 1799.
27. To authorize Francis X. Martin and Robert Ogden, jun. of the town of Newbern to dispose of books by lottery.
28. To amend an act passed in the year 1792, entitled "An act to establish separate general musters and elections in the counties of Craven and Beaufort."
29. For the relief of the Mechanics of the town of Wilmington.
30. To alter the names of persons therein mentioned.
31. To authorize St. John's Lodge No. 3 to raise by way of Lottery the sum of two thousand dollars.
32. To authorize the Trustees of Lumberton Academy, to raise a certain sum by way of lottery to complete the building of said Academy.
33. To repeal an act entitled "an act to alter the time of holding the election in the County of Duplin, passed last Session."
34. To amend an act entitled "an act granting separate elections in Onslow County."
35. Giving further compensation to Witnesses and Jurors attending the Superior Courts within this State.
36. To emancipate Charles the property of Matthew Davis Sen. in the county of Saffy.
37. To incorporate Unanimity Lodge No. 34 in Rockford Surry County.
38. To amend an act passed at Hillsborough in the year 1784, entitled an act for the ascertaining the fees of Pilots and appointing commissioners at Ocracoke, Beaufort and Bogue Inlets so far as respects Beaufort Inlet.
39. For dividing the State into Districts for the purpose of electing Representatives to Congress.
40. For the relief of the Tutacora Nation of Indians.
41. To empower the county Court of Wayne to appoint a proper person to copy the Register's Books in said County.
42. Authorizing the administrators of Valentine Huff late of the county of Rowan to sell and convey a certain part of the real estate of the said Valentine.
43. To establish a Seminary of Learning at Spring Hill in the county of Lenoir and to incorporate the same.
44. To provide for the better regulation of the Town of Smithfield.
45. To establish two separate Battalion Musters in the county of Onslow.
46. To prevent the vile practice of dueling within this State.
47. To incorporate the Royal White Heart Lodge No. 2 in the Town of Halifax.
48. To repeal an act passed at the last Session of the General Assembly entitled an act to repeal part of the inspection laws now in force in this State.
49. Making further compensation to the Superior Court Jurors for the Districts of Halifax and Edenton.
50. To Devorce John Spell of the County of Edgecombe from his Wife Celia.
51. Vesting certain lands in the different persons therein mentioned.
52. To alter the time of electing Commissioners for the Town of Statesville in Iredell County.
53. An act to pardon and restore to credit John Hamilton of the county of New-Hanover, and William Laws of the county of Wilkes.
54. To provide for the payment of Jurors to the county Court of Currituck.
55. An act to empower the acting Wardens of the county of Cur-

- rituck to transfer to Josiah Nicholson of said county a certain peice of land.
56. An act to repeal an act of the last General Assembly entitled "an act respecting retailing spirituous liquors so far as respects the counties of Orange and Person."
57. An act to amend the several laws now in force to improve the Navigation of Cape Fear and Deep and Haw Rivers.
58. An act to authorize and empower the county Trustees of Person to sue for and collect from the collection of the county the county tax for the year 1791.
59. An act to authorize the county courts mentioned to lay a tax for defraying the expence incurred in said counties.
60. An act to alter the time of holding the county court of Johnston.
61. Granting a separate election in the county of Washington.
62. An act to repeal an act entitled, "an act to regulate and fix the prices for inspecting and coopersing tobacco at Fayetteville" passed in the year 1791.
63. An act to empower the commissioners therein named to lay off into Lots, the land formerly laid off as town commons adjoining the town of Warrenton, and to sell the same, and other purposes.
64. An act to amend the several acts for regulating the Pilotage and Navigation of Cape Fear river.
65. An act to alter the place of holding one of the separate elections in the county of Ashe.
66. An act to incorporate the Rising Sun Lodge, No. 38 of Mordecai.
67. An act for the relief of Uriah Sullivan late Sheriff of Brunswick county.
68. An act to alter the time of holding the county court of Caldwell.
69. An act to establish a separate election at the house of William Jenkins in Iredell county.
70. An act granting three separate elections to the inhabitants of the county of Duplin.
71. An act to establish an Academy at the court-house in Caldwell county.
72. An act altering the time of holding the separate election at Mattamuskeet in Hyde county.
73. An act to alter the names of the persons therein mentioned and legitimate them.
74. An act to repeal part of an act passed in 1801 entitled an act to empower the county Courts of Wilkes, Meckre and Ashe to lay a tax for the purpose of destroying wolves in said counties, and to repeal an act passed in 1797, giving power to the county court of Buncombe, to lay a tax for the purpose of destroying wolves and janfers.
75. Granting a separate election in the town of Snecsborough in Anson county.
76. An act to alter the time of holding the several separate elections in Surry and to establish an additional separate election in said county, and for other purposes.
77. Granting a separate election to the inhabitants of Wilkes.
78. For the better regulation of the Sheriff's Fees.
79. An act to prevent conspiracies and insurrections among the slaves.
80. Granting a separate election at Averborough in Cumberland.
81. An act to divorce Isaac Cowan of Rowan from his wife Sarah.
82. An act to establish an Academy in the county of Franklin.
83. An act to repeal part of an act passed at Hillsborough in 1784, so far as respects Richmond County

- entitled an act to empower the several county courts therein mentioned to lay a tax annually for the purpose of executing or repairing the court house prison and stocks in each county where necessary, and for defraying the contingent charges of the county.
84. An act to amend an act directing the manner in which the confiscated lands shall in future be disposed of passed in 1801.
85. An act to establish a road ferry at Elizabeth city in Pasquotank county.
86. An act to secure to Elizabeth Campbell wife of Archibald Campbell, such estate as she may hereafter acquire.
87. Granting three separate elections to the inhabitants of Randolph county.
88. Granting a separate battalion muster in the county of Pitt, and to alter the place of holding the separate election in said county.
89. An act to ascertain in what manner disputed claims to land warrants for lands entered in the office of John Armstrong and for military lands, shall be tried and determined.
90. An act to raise a revenue for the payment of the civil list and contingent charges of government for the year 1803.
91. An act for running and ascertaining the Boundary Line between the counties of Montgomery and Cabarrus.
92. An act to establish a town on John Strother's land on the north side of French Broad River, in Buncombe county, opposite or a little above the upper warm springs therein mentioned.
93. An act to amend the several acts for regulating the pilotage and navigation of Cape Fear river.
94. An act to carry into effect a contract between the State and Phineas Millar and Eli Whitney.
95. Directing the duty of patrols in the counties of Gates, Camden, and Pasquotank.
96. Establishing an additional election and battalion muster in Craven county.
97. To emancipate the persons therein mentioned.
98. An act to divide the second regiment in Rowan into two battalion musters.
99. An act to repeal an act entitled "An act to empower the county court of Mecklenburg, to lay a tax annually for the payment of its jurors, in 1799."
100. For the further regulation of the city of Raleigh, and to amend the acts heretofore passed for that purpose.
101. Empowering Richard Allen, Sheriff of Wilkes county, to collect the arrears of taxes due him.
102. To amend the quarantine laws of this State.
103. Giving further time for registering grants, proving deeds, mesne conveyances, and powers of attorney, which have not been proven and registered within the time heretofore limited by law.
104. To keep open the South Yadkin River, and Hunting Creek, from the mouth of said Creek as far as they extend through the counties of Rowan and Iredell.
105. To Empower Thomas C. Williams, Sheriff of Montgomery county, John Matlock Sheriff of Rockingham, and Samuel Speight, Sheriff of Greene, to collect the arrears of taxes due them for 1799.
106. An act to repeal the third section of an act passed in 1799, entitled an act directing the Judges of the Superior court to meet together and settle questions of law or equity arising on their circuit and to provide for the trial of all persons concerned in certain frauds.
107. To provide for the relief of persons who have obtained grants for lands which are covered in whole or in part by grants of older date.
108. Establishing separate elections in Johnston county.
