#### TREASURY DEPARTMENT,

Washington, Sept. 1A, 1800. Public Notice is hereby given,

TN purfuance of an act of Congreis, passed on the 23d I day of April, one thousand eight hundred, entitled

- " An aft to eftablish a General Stamp Office,"
- I. That a General Stamp-Office is now effablished at the feat of government, in the city of Washington, from whence there will iffne, from and after the date hereof, (opon the application of the Supervilors of the Revenue, under whole mauagement the collection of the firmp duties is placed) any quanticles of paper, parchment and vellam, marked or flamped, and duly counter flamped, with the following rates of duty which are demandable by law .---

Far every ficin or piece of vellum or parchment, or fheet or piece of paper, upon which shall be written or printed any or either of the inflruments or writings following, to wit :

#### Any certificate of naturalization, 5 dols.

Any licenfe to practice, or certificate of the admiffion, enrollment or registry of any counfellor, folicitor, attorney, advocate or proctor, in any court of the United States, to dols.

Provided, That a certificate in any one of the courts of the United States, for any one of the faid offices, fhall fo far as relates to the payment of the duty afore faid, be a fufficient admission in all courts of the United States, for each and every of the faid offices. Any grant or letters prient, under the feal or authori-

ty of the Usited States (except for lands granted

If above five hundred dollars and not exceeding one thouland dollars, 20 centi. If above one thousand dollars. 30 cents.

Any foreign bill of exchange, d aft or order for the

payment of money in any foreign country. 20 cts. The faid duty being chargeable upon each and every bill of exchange, without respect to the number

contained in each fet.

- Any note or bill of lading or writing, or receipt in nature thereof, for goods or merchandize to be exported:
- If from one diftrict to another diffrict of the U. States, not being in the fame flate, 4 cents.
- If from the United States ' any foreign port or place, 10 cents.

The faid duty being chatteable upon each and every bill of lading without acfpect to the number

contained in each it. Any notes iffued i were banks now effablished or that may be hereafter eftabliched within the U. States, other than the notes of fuc' of the faid banks, as fhall agree to an annual composition of one per centum on the annual dividends made by fuch banks. to their flockholden referencely, according to the following fcale :

- II. That the power of the Supervisors cethe Revenue to mark or flamp any vellum, parchment or paper, chargeable with duty, will ceafe and determine from and after fix months from the date hereof, to wit, on the laft day of February, 1801.
- III. That if any perions shall, after the last day of February 1301, have in their cullody or poffeffion, any vellum, parchment or paper, maiked or flamp. ed by the Supervifors of the Revenue, upon which any matter or thing, charged with duty, fhall not have been written or printed, they may at any time within the space of fixty days after the faid last day of February 1801, bring or fend luch vellum, parchment and paper, unto fome office of infpection, and in lieu thereof, receive a like quantity of value of vellam, parchment and paper, duly flamped, in purfuance of the act herein before recited. And in cafe any perfon thall neglect or refuse, within the time aforefaid, to bring or caufe to be brought unto fome officer of infpection; any fuch vellum, parchment or paper, it is hereby declared, that the fame will there things, which may after that time be written or printed upon any vellum, parchment or paper, authorized to be exchanged in manner aforefaid, will be of no other effect, than if they had been written or printtel on paper, parchment or vellum, not marked or hamped.
- IV. And for the convenience of those perfons who may be inclined to have their own yellum, parch. ment and paper stamped or marked, it is hereby declared, that when any perfon shall deposit any vellum, parchment or paper at the office of a fupervifor, accompanied with a lift, fpecifying the number and denomination of the flamps or marks, which are defired to be thereto affixed, the fame will be transmitted to the General Stamp Office, and there properly marked or flamped, and forthwith fent back to the fame fupervifor, who will thereupon collect the duties and deliver the paper, parchment or vel lum, to the order of the perfon from whom the fame was received.
