I expect he will endeavor to get on to some of the northern sea-ports, and pass for a free man. All owners and masters of vessels are forewarned from employing or carrying away said fellow under the strictest penalty of the law.

If said **LODRICK** is apprehended and secured within this State, so that I get him, I will pay a reward of Fifty Dollars, and if taken out of the State and secured so that I get him, I will pay One Hundred Dollars to the person so apprehending said fellow and forwarding me information that will lead to his recovery.

United States of America, NORTH-CAROLINA DISTRICT.

To the Marshal of the District, Greeting.

WHEREAS T. P. Devereux, Esq. as Proctor for William Pratt, Byrd Beverly, and John Robinson, Merchants of London, hath exhibited a libel or complaint in the District Court of the United States, for the Pamlico District; stating, alledging and propounding, that the brig Ann sailed from Cuba in the month of June, 1819, with a cargo of sugar, coffee, and logwood, and on her voyage was captured by pirates; and that a part of the said cargo, and a large sum of money, were brought to the port of Newbern by a certain Henry S. Neale, and by him placed in the hands of John Devereux, Stephen M. Chester, & Robert V. Orme, residents of Newbern: And whereas the Judge of the District Court for the District aforesaid, hath ordered and directed the fourth Monday in April next, for all persons concerned to be cited and intimated to appear in the Court-House in the town of Newbern, and shew cause, if any they have, why judgment should not pass as prayed: You are therefore hereby authorized, empowered and strictly enjoined, poremporarily to cite and admonish said Henry S. Neale, John Devereux, Stephen M. Chester and Robert V. Orme, and all persons whatsoever having or pretending to have any right, title, interest or claim in or to the said cargo of brig Ann, libelled against as aforesaid, by publishing this monition in the *Carolina Centinel* for some time, and by all other lawful ways, means and methods whatsoever, whereby this monition may be made most public and notorious, to be and appear at the time and place aforesaid, before the Judge aforesaid, and also to attend upon every session and sessions, to be held there and from thence, until a definitive sentence shall be read and promulgated in the said business inclusively, if any of them shall think it their duty so to do, to hear, abide by and perform all and singular such judicial acts as are necessary, and by law required to be done and expedited in the premises; and further to do and receive what unto law and justice shall appertain, under the pain of the law and the contempt thereof; the absence and contumacy of them and every of them in any wise notwithstanding. And whatsoever you shall do in the premises, you shall duly certify unto the Judge aforesaid, at the time and place aforesaid, together with these presents.

BY THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES.

WHEREAS, by various acts of Congress, the President of the United States is authorized to direct the public lands which have been surveyed to be offered for sale:

Therefore, I, James Monroe, President of the United States, do hereby declare and make known, that public sales, for the disposal (according to law) of public lands, shall be held as follows, viz:

At Franklin, in Missouri, on the first Monday in January next, for the sale of

Townships 51 to 55, in range 26, west of the 5th principal meridian line.
 50 to 55, ranges 27 and 28 do.
 51 to 55, range 29 do.

At the same place, on the first Monday in March next, for the sale of

Townships 51 to 56, in range 30, west of the 5th principal meridian line.
 50 to 56, in ranges 31, 32 & 33 do.
 At St. Louis, in the said state, on the first Monday in December next for the sale of

2, east of the 5th principal meridian line.

At the same place, on the first Monday in March next, for the sale of

Townships 35 to 44, in ranges 3 and 4 east.

At the same place, on the first Monday in May next, for the sale of

Townships 35 to 44, in range 5 and 6, east, and of 43 and 44, in range 7 east.

At Jackson, in the county of Cape Girardeau, in the said state, on the first Monday in February next, for the sale of

Townships 34, in ranges 1 to 14 east of the 5th principal meridian line.

At Detroit, in Michigan Territory, on the first Monday in November next, for the sale of range

Except such lands as have been or may be reserved by law for the support of schools, or for other purposes. The lands shall be sold in regular numerical order, beginning with the lowest number of section, township, and range.
