Laws of the United States, passed at the Second Session of the 19th Congress.

An Act making appropriations for the support of Government for the year one thousand eight hundred and twenty seven.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That the following sums be, and the same are hereby, respectively, appropriated, for the serice of the year one thousand eight hun dred and twenty-seven; that is to say:
